Meanwhile, the township must find an answer to a citation by the state concerning pollution of the Upper Rouge river.

**Interceptor Plan Has Aug. Meeting**

Next meeting of communities in the Evergreen Drainage District has been called for Wednesday, Aug. 18, when members of the informal authority will discuss proposed financing of the interceptor plan.

Objections to the financing method will be heard if they persist and if these differences can be ironed out, area communities will be asked to agree on principle with the proposed financing procedure.
