Police Department Promises to Be Low Cost Agency

FRANKLIN—Creation of the Franklin Village police department may cost the new village only \$80, Marshall Dan Brown reported to board members Monday night. The village still will depend on the Oakland county sheriff's department and Michigan State police for major crimes and accidents, but will enforce its own traffic ordinances, Brown explained. Initial bills for the village will be for a flasher and siren for Brown's car, which he will operate on his own gas and oil, and badges for deputies. Brown paid for his own revolver and added that a summer police uniform can be garnered from his old military clothing.

HE URGED immediate action on a village traffic ordinance and also suggested that the village could take advantage of purchasing a two-way police radio through the Office of Civilian Defense and pay only one-third of the equipment's cost.

Board members learned that a village could not get up its own municipal court but would be forced to take cases to a Southern circuit court of the peace. Brown is studying the possibility of using the fire department's telephone for police calls nights, Sundays and holidays. Police calls during weekdays can be taken at the Franklin post office where Brown is employed.

Township Offers \$5,560 Settlement

SOUTHFIELD—A check for \$5,560.57 in full settlement of assets and liabilities between the Township of Southfield and the City of Lathrup Village was ordered sent to the new city by township board members Monday night. Lathrup still has to approve the final settlement figure and accept the check.

The settlement represents money owed Lathrup after its incorporation which was first set at \$29,531.76 but has been whittled down since the effective settlement date of May 22, 1953 by township service charges to the city.

Only minor points of the settlement computation are expected to be questioned by Lathrup officials.

Southfield Again Signs Fire Pact

SOUTHFIELD—Weary township board members expressed the hope Tuesday night that the latest revised fire contract for the Lathrup Village will be accepted by city councilmen at the council's meeting August 2.

In passing on the latest of the many contract forms, township officials were assured by letter from Lathrup City Administrator Leonard Watowski that the city would approve the contract at its next meeting.

Charges for the services that could bring fire protection for the city until 1957 remain the same under the contract but hydrant maintenance was transferred to the responsibility of the city.

Months of negotiations over fire protection for the new city have produced contract revisions and revisions on the revisions as the two governmental bodies haggle over the type of protection to be offered and the amount of charges for the service.

Seek Legal Advice On Acceptance Of Subdivisions

SOUTHFIELD—Township board members Tuesday night voted to seek legal advice on the township's rights in accepting subdivision plats in the face of a writ of mandamus threatened by a developer.

The board agreed with Supervisor William Roesser that the township should not be forced to accept platting if any aspect of the proposed development suggested future trouble for the township.

The question was raised when Roesser refused to accept the design of a central septic tank sewer system proposed for Bell Acres Estate subdivision, a 42-lot sub on the northeast corner of Bell road and Eleven Mile.

He also blocked passage of the plat until the septic tank plans were brought up to standards he felt were advisable.

Body of Unborn Child Discovered

BLOOMFIELD—The body of an unborn child believed about 1 1/2 months old was found last Thursday morning on the Kensington roadside about 300 yards north of Big Beaver road.

It had been wrapped in newspapers and placed in a shoe box. County Coroner Isaac C. Prevatte fixed the miscarriage as having taken place about 2 a.m. Thursday.

It was discovered about 11:30 a.m. by two contractors, Frank Melon Jr., of 19223 Graydale, Detroit, and Ernest Melone of Livonia in Oak Park.

An investigation is being conducted by Detectives Mahlon France and David Brand of the Oakland county sheriff's department.
