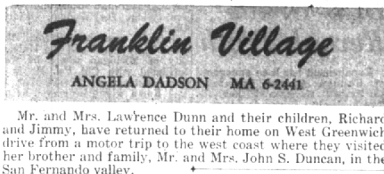

Tells of Hong Kong's Acute Water Shortage

Writing from Singapore, July 14, Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Steelman III, make Birmingham's water supply picture not quite so grim.

The former Birmingham residents, now stationed in the orient for Lederle laboratories, had spent a few days in Hong Kong where conditions are really "dry".

"We had almost two weeks in Hong Kong," Mrs. Steelman wrote, "but, much as we love it, were glad to move on. It is very hot at this time of the year and they are experiencing an acute water shortage."

"Hot water was available only 15 minutes during the day and cold water for three hours—from 5 to 8 p.m., the hour when people are usually enjoying tea, dashing off to cocktail parties, etc."

"Now that hour finds everyone hurrying home to take the daily bath or do the little washing which most of us do even in this land of servants."

Mrs. Steelman said that, while Singapore was hot, the wonderful accommodations available to them made their stay there most enjoyable. The hotel is situated right on the Straits of Singapore so there is nearly always a cool breeze.

EN ROUTE to Singapore from Hong Kong, their plane landed at Saigon, where the airport was full of military personnel.

"We saw hundreds of troops, including paratroopers in battle dress," the Steelmans said. "Just before our arrival a hospital plane had landed, full of the wounded."

"Some of our Vietnamese friends came to the airport to visit with us during the time we were there. They seemed to feel the division would take place at the 16th parallel. They told us they would now be free and all would be very right! Who told them I do not know, but it certainly sounds like propaganda."

After leaving Birmingham in June, their first visit here in three years, the Steelmans went first to New York, then to Minneapolis, Seattle, Victoria and Vancouver. They flew from Seattle to Anchorage, Alaska and "were completely silenced by the vastness of the far north—it is grand (in the true sense of the word), awe-inspiring, chilling and forbidding in its frozen splendor, but magnificently beautiful, too."

SHEMYA IN the Aleutians was the next stop, one which did not impress the Steelmans at all. They describe it as desolate, bleak and cold with little vegetation and crude housing.

A week in Japan included a trip to Osaka where they visited the huge chemical plants and were the guests of Chobi Takeda and his wife. They were taken to nearby cities and made stops at several area shrines.

The couple left Singapore July 24 to spend about a month in Indonesia before returning to their Seaview hotel on the Straits.

A performance tonight of "East of the Sun, West of the Moon" will end the season for the Junior division, Cranbrook summer theater.

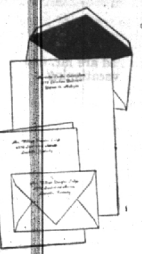
The dramatic adaptation of the familiar fairy story was written by Carl G. Womberger and will include 52 intermediate and junior students in the cast.
