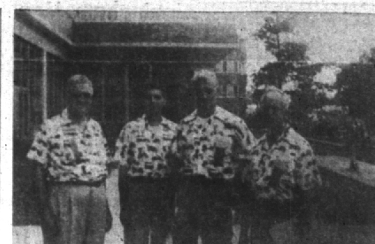
The workers helped evacuate the 42 patients and get them into other shelters. They supplied food for firemen and other workers and helped in the cleanup job resulting from fire, water, smoke and soot.

With National Guardsmen they operated a canteen from 11 a.m.

until nearly nightfall, distributing coffee, sandwiches and cookies donated by Pontiac Motors and the Red Cross.

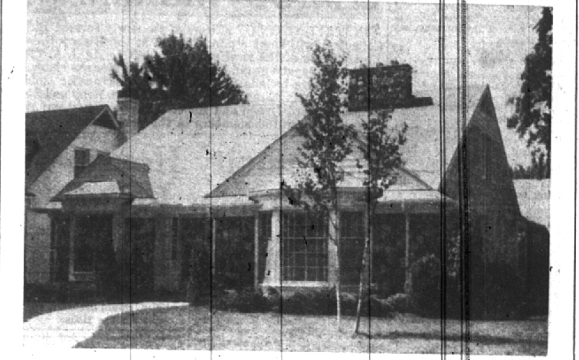

The Grant teams are composed of Patti Bugas, Kitten James and Lou Wilson; Skip Down Zander Duffield and Howie Miller.

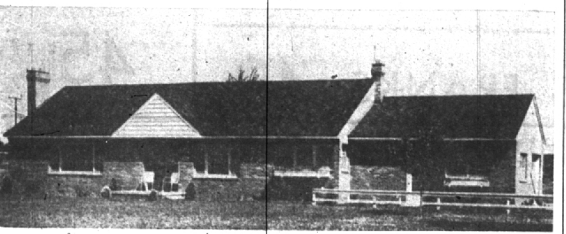
Riding for the Open Hunt club will be Marie Lindquist, Jocelyn Schofield and Carol Pierre.

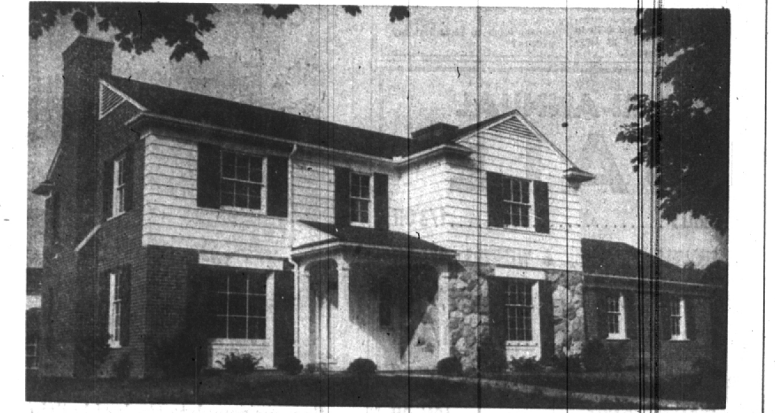
