Highway Aid Program 'Very Satisfactory'

With 156 persons participating, the "Highway First Aid Service" program sponsored by the American Red Cross, Oakland County chapter, over the holiday weekend has been declared "very satisfactory" by chapter officials and highway police officers.

The program saw first aid teams from the Red Cross paired with members of the Oakland County Amateur Radio club to patrol special danger zones on all area highways. Added to these ground teams, a mobile airborne unit pat-

rolled "Suicide Road," that section of DS-10 just north of Pontiac. James Abbott of Birmingham, director of the "hams," said there were no serious accidents but that the group "did have lots of activity and plenty of experience."

He reported a number of minor property damage accidents and a few injuries were referred to the team.

Mrs. Mildred Bennett reporting Tuesday for first aid chairman (Ralph A. Forman, said the program appeared "most successful." She said members of the sheriff's department and state police had "unofficially endorsed it indicating they felt future units should be ready to answer calls in the future, especially on heavy-traffic holidays."

THE GROUP checked up about 92 hours of highway time, working from 4 to 10 p.m., Friday through Monday.

A call for a drowning, prior to the Friday start, indicated future plans should consider starting activities earlier. There were from five to nine cars on the road each day, with three stationary units. Mrs. Bennett said many drivers made favorable comments on the program, both from a standpoint of the service rendered and the fact that just seeing these units made them drive more carefully.
