Christ Church Plans Fall School Classes

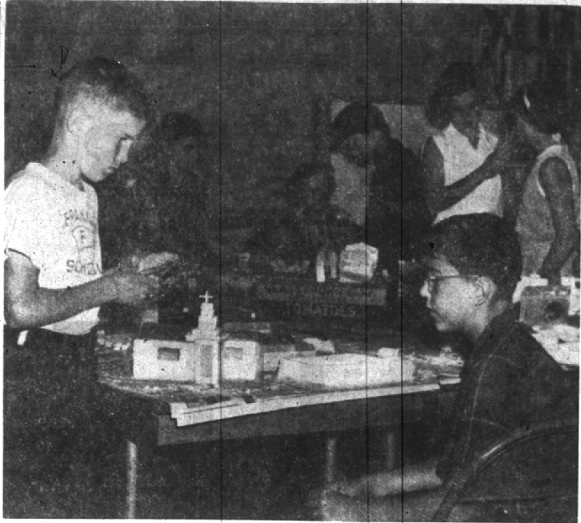
Second Fellowship Recipient Arrives At Christ Church

A graduate of Virginia Theological seminary, the Rev. Eugene A. Monick, Jr., has become Christ Church Cranbrook's second incumbent of the Marquis Fellowship. He arrived last week to begin his 12 months association with the church staff.

Succeeding the Rev. Joel W. Marchison for the Fellowship, Mr. Monick was ordained to the Deaconate in St. Paul, Minn., on June 19. He is a native of that city.

The Fellowship was established by parish sanction two years ago as a memorial to Christ Church's first rector, the Rev. Samuel S. Marquis, to give "on the job" training for young clergymen.

During his one year of service, the incumbent is assigned specific responsibilities in the work of the parish. In addition, he has the opportunity for further study and for observing all the aspects of parish life before being assigned to a church of his own.

Discusses Unity Of Christian Church Groups

Speaking at the First Baptist church July 7, the Rev. G. Merrill Lenox, D.D., reviewed plans for the approaching meeting of the World Council of Churches in Evanston, Ill.

The ecumenical program will have Dr. Lenox speaking on "We Christians Belong Together."

Dr. Lenox said the Illinois meeting, which the Rev. Emil Konz, pastor of the Baptist church will attend, will attract representatives and visitors from 140 denominations of about 60 nations.

"The basis of the council meeting," he explained, "will be to show how all churches can and should work together for the betterment of the world."
