Shrimp Mold Made in Advance

This is one luncheon dish that always rates requests for the recipe whenever Mrs. Walter Herdick, 201 Baldwin avenue, serves it.

"It is a luncheon dish particularly suited for a women's gathering and can be made in advance (in fact it is better made the day before) so there is little fussing when the appointed luncheon hour arrives.

Mrs. Herdick, who is a member of St. Anne's Guild of St. James church, is also active in the Kappa Alpha Theta Alumni Association and has served this molded shrimp salad to both of these groups.

The salad as the main dish is served with hot buttered rolls, potato chips, carrot sticks and ripe olives. Cookies for dessert and coffee or tea, of course.

"This makes a satisfying luncheon for a women's group," said Mrs. Herdick, "and easy to prepare."

MOLDED SHRIMP SALAD

- 1 can tomato soup
- 2 3-ounce packages cream cheese
- 1 1/2 tablespoons gelatine
- scant 1/2 cup cold water
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- Heat soup. Break cream cheese into small chunks and put in hot soup. Beat until smoothed with rotary beater. Add gelatine to cold water, then thickened up to above mixture of soup and gelatine, and blend well. Add mayonnaise, celery, pepper, shrimp and seasonings. Mold.

This makes one eight inch ring mold which will serve 10.
