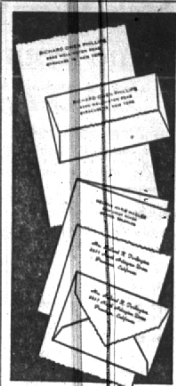
Mrs. Wells is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William S. James of the North Adams address.
