Linda Miller, of Waukesha, Wis., is a sophomore at the University of Wisconsin, is home for the summer.

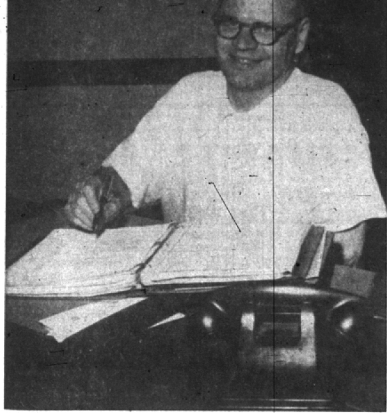
Mark Smith, son of the George W. Smiths, is motoring on a month's tour of the west with two other Dartmouth graduates.
