Art Academy Students Modernize Ohio City

Haphazard growth of factories, residential areas and shopping centers is no longer a problem confined to big cities. Many smaller communities are beginning to worry about what form their coming expansion will take.

The citizens of one such town, Marietta, Ohio, will soon have a dream peek into their future, and can begin choosing how much of the dream they want to come true.

Known as Ohio's first community, Marietta is concerned with preserving its historic identity while adapting to an expected upsurge of industry, and has launched a program of planning which will well set a trend for towns of similar size.

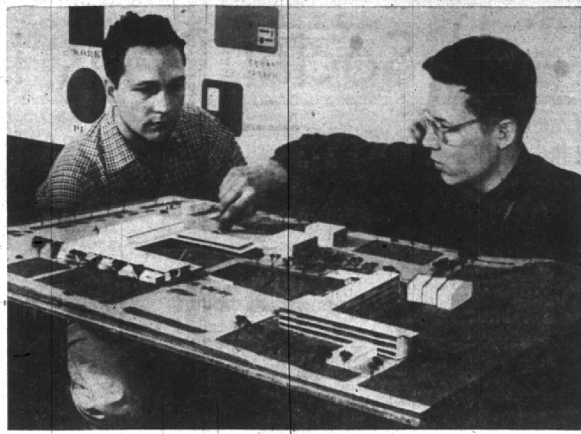
Civic leaders, wishing to avoid the dangers of uncontrolled expansion, decided that the first step was to seek an over-all plan for the most practical, economical and attractive pattern of development.

OVER SIX months ago such a plan was requested of the architecture and urban planning department of Cranbrook Academy of Art.

In July the citizens of Marietta will be able to see their "city of the future" in colored charts, architectural plans and three-dimensional models, including large detailed models of a community center and a college chapel, with studies of sculpture, a mural and swatches of the woven material suggested for interior decoration.

Idealistic as this lay-out may seem at first glance, it is based on detailed studies of transportation, agriculture, topography and industrial potential for the entire Ohio valley as well as an existing conditions in the town itself.

Located on a bend of the Ohio River, Marietta has a recurrent flood program. The new plan provides for moving commerce and industry to higher ground.
