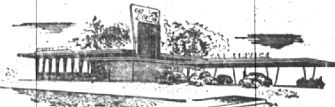

Baldwin PTA Board Sets June 14 Meet; Lists New Officers

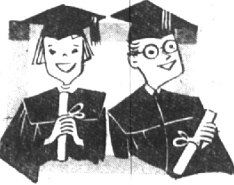
First meeting of the 1954-55 executive board of Baldwin PTA will be at 8 p.m., June 14, in the school library.

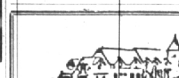

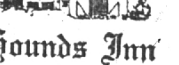
