

Cranbrook Music Guild Election

The original officers of the Cranbrook Music Guild relinquished their posts last week when the annual election saw LeRoy W. Dahlberg named president. He will succeed Mrs. Benjamin Brewster.

Reviewing the organization's activities, Mrs. Brewster said current membership was nearly 400 and was looking toward its third year with great hope.

The guild has issued 512 tickets to students, faculty and staff members of the six "Cranbrook community" institutions.

The 1954-55 program will open in October with a concert by the Berkley Quartet. On Jan. 8, 1955, two concerts will be given by the Detroit Symphony orchestra, an afternoon program for children and an evening appearance for adults.

Founded in February, 1932, nine of the original 11 officers have been serving until the current election. Most will continue as board members or with the advisory committee responsible for the selection of program material.

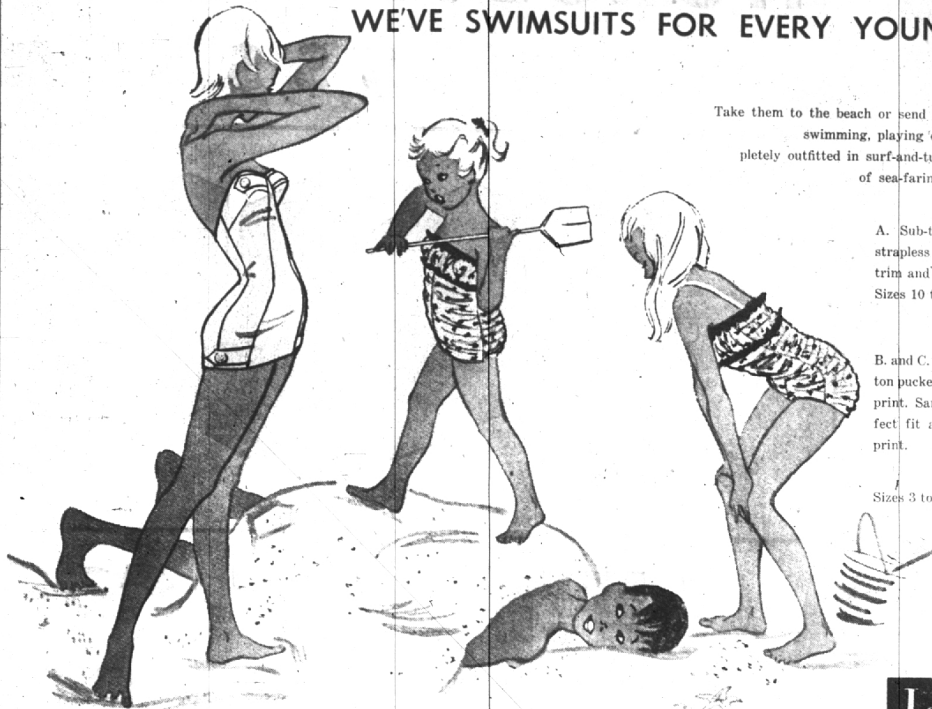

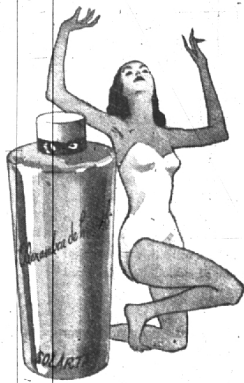

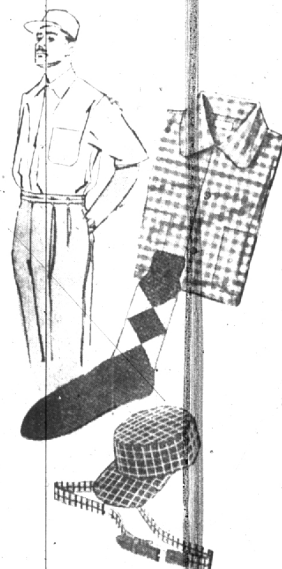
