Joslyn Awards Highlight High School 'Swing Outs'

Returning to the popular tradition of an all-student program, the senior class of 1954 presented the annual swing-out assembly last Friday morning for 1200 underclassmen and about 500 parents and friends.

Features of the program were the first presentation of the Marc Joslyn memorial awards before the student body and dedication of the official hymn of Birmingham high school.

Marc Joslyn awards went to Sarah Colwell and John Hubert, active and popular members of the graduating class. Awards were presented for the first time last year at the commencement exercises.

THE SWING-OUT program used the theme "Our Very Own" and used an all-student cast of about 120 members. It was the first swing-out assembly of this type since 1951, other classes having paid assemblies using only student chairmen and honors announcements.

Another return to tradition was the presentation of six orchids to the six girls ranking highest in scholarship. Bary flowers furnished white orchids for this popular honor. The top six boys were presented bookends by the class.

The program consisted of 31 acts, including a preview which recounted the triumphs of the year. Represented in this act were championships in six of eight sports; All-American swimmers; winners of the Goldsmith, freethrow, Johnson, Minting and Zoulin Memorial trophies; national first place Buchlander; winners of music and speech distinctions and scholarships; the Student Congress first place project trophy; Civil Air Patrol overseas scholarship and state representative to U. S. Congress dinner; best Washington group.

A HIGHLIGHT of the program was the singing of the "Birmingham" new official hymn for Birmingham high school. Lyrics for the song were written by Miss Virginia McCall, English instructor, and music was composed by Jerome Neff, a Maple graduate.

The morning was devoted to the honors assembly, at which time athletic, scholastic and citizenship awards were given.


