Year's First Diseased Elm Discovered

Discovery of this year's first case of Dutch Elm disease in the city of Birmingham was announced Tuesday by City Forester William LeBOLD.

A report received Friday from Michigan state laboratories disclosed that a tree at 450 Tooting Lane was infected with the disease that invariably spells death for elm trees.

LeBOLD said the tree was removed and destroyed Monday to prevent spread of the disease to other trees in the area.

Twenty-six Birmingham elms were lost to the disease last year.

PRIVATE PROPERTY owners and neighborhood groups are urged by LeBOLD to take steps to have their trees sprayed in cooperation with the city effort.

LeBOLD has offered to furnish information about reliable spraying companies to anyone wishing to call him at his office in the Birmingham department of public works.

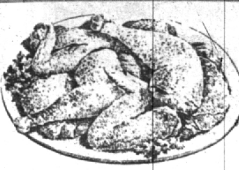
Troy Refers Bid On New Fire Truck
