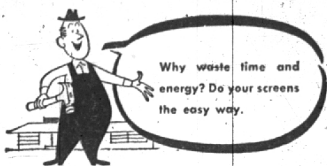


**Rotary Anns Meet**

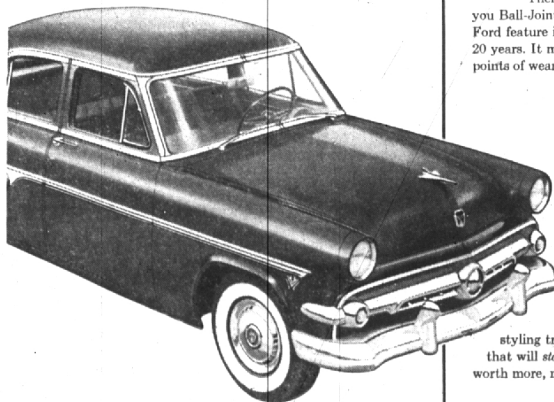
