# Red Cross Votes Blood Program Continuation

Executive Committee of Oakland county chapter, American Red Cross, voted June 18 to "keep the Red Cross blood program going at cost".

The retiring committee met for its last session at the Red Cross chapter house, 2617 Franklin, Pontiac. A new executive committee takes over next week starting the blood program in July.

Hudget committee chairman, Harry Rendell, Jr., of Royal Oak and co-convenor, Edmer Bland, of Springfield township, and Harold B. Euler, Pontiac, presented a pared-down budget of \$78,922, accepted to run the chapter for the coming year.

The Red Cross still faces a \$10,000 deficit of expenses over income, but hopes that Detroit, Pontiac and Oakland county United Funds or its own 1958 fund drive in South Oakland will make up the balance.

RAWSON VAILE, 864 Pilgrim, prominent Detroit industrialist, died Saturday, June 19, in the Harper hospital, Detroit, after a prolonged illness.

Mr. Vaile, 67, was executive vice president and director of the American Blower Corp. of Dearborn, and a director of the Canadian Sirocco Co., Limited, Windsor, Ont.

He was born at Kokomo, Ind., in 1886 and graduated from Purdue university in 1909 with a BSME degree. He took post graduate work at Columbia university and came to American Blower in 1912 as a sales engineer.

Soon assigned to the Pittsburgh office, he was transferred to the Rochester office in 1913. In 1914 he was made manager of the corporation's export department in New York. He became general sales manager in 1916. In 1917, he joined the United States Army as a first lieutenant.

FOLLOWING his discharge in 1919, he resumed his duties as sales manager until 1922, when he was made assistant secretary, secretary and treasurer, and in 1933 was appointed executive vice president.

Mr. Vaile was widely interested in sports and had been personally active as a member of the Purdue university football team. He was a member of the Phi Gamma Delta fraternity, and a past president of the Purdue alumni club.
