## Start First Unit Of Adams Village Development Here

Wallace E. Reid and Hamilton H. Paterson of Reid-Paterson Inc., Birmingham builders, announce the start of the first unit of "Adams Village." Ground breaking ceremonies were held Tuesday at Torry and Haynes for Birmingham's newest planned home community development located in the heart of Birmingham on a 45 acre plot on Adams road, formerly the Porritt property.

The ceremonies were attended by Wendell Edwards, Michigan State Director, type Federal Housing Administration, Charles R. Renfrew, Mayor of Birmingham, R. R. Gare, City Engineer of Birmingham, T. O. Streeves, assistant vice president of The Detroit Bank, Charles Morrison, manager of the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce, A. Warner, Birmingham manager of the Michigan Bell Telephone company, Harold J. Hall, district manager of the Detroit Edison company, Herbert H. Gardner, president of the Birmingham National Bank, and Walter L. Moreland, president of the Birmingham Federal Savings & Loan Association.

"Adams Village" is planned as a community of 108 two family duplexes and 10 single homes, all to be sold to individual purchasers. In the duplexes, the purchaser will acquire the entire building with accommodations for two families or he may purchase one-half with accommodations for only his own family.

"ADAMS VILLAGE" land planning was done in cooperation with the land planning division of the Federal Housing Administration. The sites for the duplexes vary from 61 feet to 80 feet in width and the sites for the single homes vary from 58 feet to 64 feet in width. The minimum lot depth is 137 feet. There are two business areas on Adams road, both with off-street parking space.

Present plans call for duplexes which will sell for \$27,000 to \$30,000 per two family building or \$13,500 to \$15,000 per one family dwelling unit. The type and price of the single homes have not yet been definitely determined.

All the duplex buildings in "Adams Village" will be designed by architects and the intention is to maintain the "colonial" feeling throughout. The present plans call for two story buildings with a variation in the set-back from the front lot line.

All construction will be by Reid-Paterson Inc. Heating will be forced air with oil or gas. Windows will be aluminum with screens and storm dash. All kitchens will have linoleum floors with plastic base, vinyl counter tops, garbage disposals and ventilating fans.

BASEMENTS WILL afford ample recreation room space, and in addition to the heating plant will provide an incinerator, automatic

gas hot water heater and plumbing roughed in for future lavatory. The plot of "Adams Village" was made by Fall & Barney of Detroit, Michigan, registered land surveyors. The engineering work was done by Arthur Gillespie of Birmingham, Michigan in cooperation with the Engineering Department of the City of Birmingham.

It is hoped that the first unit will be completed and on display during National Home Week, the latter part of September.
