## Dog, Victim of Tornado, 'Tells' Comeback Story

A year ago I couldn't laugh. I was learning again,
but it was slow and painful. Just a few weeks before I
had been a happy, carefree dog, loving my
family and
living a wonderful life.

Then the tornado struck Flint and my life, like so
many others, human and animal, was shatlered. That
was on June 12, 1953.

For days I lay in the animal shelter, sobbing for the

The master and mistress understand a dog and his troubles and are more than patient. I'm still terrified when it storms, and at those times they give me every bit of understanding any dog could want or need.

I have a lovely, comfortable home. There's a great big yard, with lots of finny little birds for me to sniff out and watch as they day way. Silly to be frightened of me, I couldn't and wouldn't eatch them.
