2. Water all newly transplanted trees, shrubs, and perennials. Mylch azaleas, rhododendrens, and mountain laurels with PEAT MOSS.

3. Birch tree miners cause birch trees to turn brown in June, Spray now with LINDANE.

4. POTATO BEETLE-Sock them with DDT.

5. CUTWORMS-Plug them in evening by dusting ground with CUTWORM DUST of a bait such as SNAROL.

6. DON'T use fast year'S ROTENOLE or PYRE-THRUM powder. NICOTINE SULPHATE does not deteriorate.

7. Dust PHLOX for mildew and red spiter with MIKE SULPHUR. Get the powder on under side as well as upper side of leaves.

8. Plaster BEANS with ROTENONE stray or dust to thwart the MEXICAN BEAN BEETLE. Cover under

sides of leaves. DO NOT USE DDT.

9. Creepers! There's a lot of CRABGASS around. Come in and see us about controls for this pest (We wouldn't be allowed to put our, thoughts into print.)
