trast to the hundreds now employed by the firm, the first payroll listed six workers, including a yard man, bookkeeper and wagon driver.

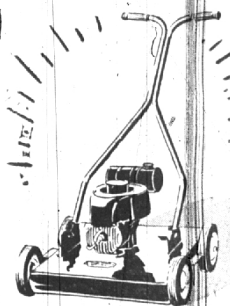
