Scouts and parents of Troop B-27 assembled in the Baptist church Scout room Tuesday, June 22, for a family hop supper prior to the troop's first court of honor.

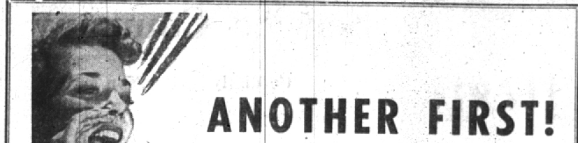
The Rev. Emil Kozt presented service citations to members of the church's M.P.'s club who have served the Scout troop during the first year.

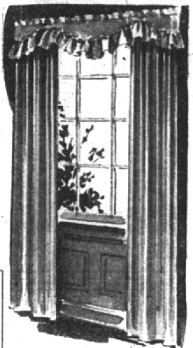

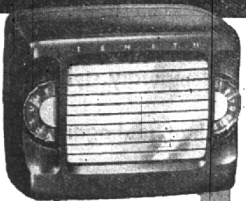

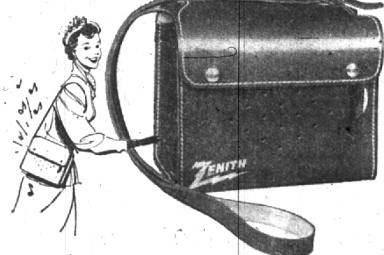
