

Tigers Hand Indians First Setback 4-0

The Giants and Indians are leading their respective Little League baseball divisions after the second week of regular play.

During last week's play the Indians suffered their first defeat at the hands of the Tigers but went on to edge the Yankees to stay ahead of the race in the American division.

Wins over Braves and Cubs kept the Giants in winning ways in the Nationals.

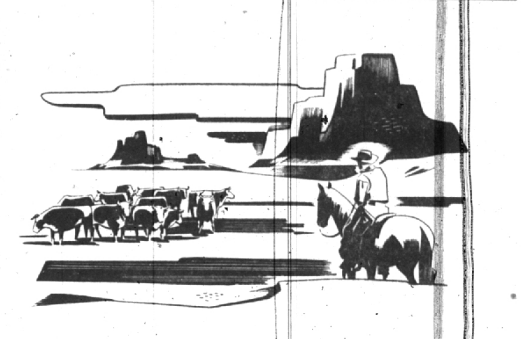
