Maples Edge Waterford; Pierce Records Tumble

Winning the closest meet of the season and breaking two Pierce field records while tying another, the Birmingham track team downed Waterford recently 59 1/2-49 1/2.

Gordon Pade shaved one-tenth of a second off the Pierce field record in the 120 yard high hurdles, running :10.1 to better Jim Barger's time set in 1953.

John Perry, Maple 440 man, ran his event in :53.2 to tie Ned Sharples' 1952 record.

The Maple medley relay team of Ron Reuter, Mark Frank, John Appleford and Alan Fuhrman ran their event in the record breaking time of 2:10.9.

Bill Dove, Maple dashman, was out with an injured leg, and Waterford's Keating and Campbell monopolized the 100 and 220.

DAVE LONG took first in the 800 in 2:09.6. Russ Hibbard and Appleford tied the high jump with a leap of 5 feet 2 1/2 inches, and then Hibbard had the bar raised to over 6 feet to try for a school record, but fell short in three tries.

Ron McCrumb cleared 10 feet 6 inches to take first place in the pole vault as Chuck Erickson met the shot 45 feet 4 inches for first with Ed Peters second with his best put of the season at 44 feet.

Maples stole four bases and had two more singles in the next frame, but two runners were tagged at the plate on infield grounders before Hower fanned to wind up the inning.

Maples executed their first twin killing of the year in the second inning on a grounder to shortstop. Bill Allen threw to second base for one out, and then Goodfellow fired to Mike Groves at first.


