Will of the State Police at Pontiac suggests that drivers follow the example set by the people in Roanoke, Va., who cut down their rear-end collisions 85 per cent by the inexpensive method of taping their rear bumpers with a 24-inch-long, inch-wide reflective tape called Scotchlite, now on sale in filling stations, groceries and drug stores.

Seen more quickly than the ordinary tail light, it becomes visible in time to give 73 extra feet in stopping distance.

Sergeant Willis states that this tape should be used only on the rear bumper, never on the front as red in front seems to confuse oncoming cars. And it should be applied to the full length of the bumper.
