Will Be Ordained In Saturday Rites

A Birmingham resident, John Francis Dunn, will be among the 26 young men ordained to the priesthood on June 5. The ceremony will be held at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit, beginning at 10:30 a.m.

His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney, archbishop of Detroit, will confer the ordination.

The young priest is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Dunn, 1561 Bates, and has been a resident of Birmingham for 28 years. He attended Holy Name school and served as an altar boy.

After being graduated from Baldwin high school, he enlisted in the US Navy and served for five years, being discharged as a gunner's mate, first class.

THE NEXT four years were spent at Sacred Heart seminary in Detroit, with an additional four years at St. John's seminary in Plymouth just being completed.

He will celebrate his first solemn high mass June 6 at 10 a.m. in Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, his family having become affiliated with this parish at its formation in 1951. Prior to this they were members of Holy Name parish.

His three brothers, George, Richard and Charles, with two cousins, Michael Dunn of Flint and Thomas Lewis of Grand Blanc, will serve as ushers. The Rev. Lucian Hebert, Pastor of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, will deliver the sermon.

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Please Take Notice that the Board of Education of School District No. 2 Fractional, Townships of Bloomfield, Troy and West Bloomfield and City of Bloomfield Hills, County of Oakland, Michigan, has called an annual election to be held in said School District on June 14, 1954.

Section (2) of Act 199, Public Acts of Michigan, 1951, effective September 28, 1951, provides as follows:

"The Inspectors of election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides"

THE LAST DAY on which persons may register with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside in order to be eligible to vote at said annual election called to be held June 14, 1954, is Friday, June 4, 1954. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, on said Friday, June 4, 1954, are not eligible to vote at said annual election.

Under the provisions of Act 199, Public Acts of Michigan, 1951, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with City and Township Clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the Clerk's office is open for registration.

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Please Take Notice that an annual election of the qualified electors of said School District will be held in said School District on June 14, 1954.

The polls of election will be open from 7:00 o'clock a.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, on said June 14, 1954. The place of election will be in the Bloomfield Hills School on Vaughan Road in said District.

The following propositions will be submitted to vote of the electors at said annual election:

- Shall the Board of Education of School District No. 2, Fractional, Townships of Bloomfield, Troy, West Bloomfield and City of Bloomfield Hills, County of Oakland, Michigan, be directed to make sale of the Tuscarora School building and Site, which said school building and site are no longer needed for school purposes.
- Shall the County School District of Oakland County, State of Michigan, come under the provisions of The Special Education Act, which statute is designed to encourage the education of the handicapped children; Provided, that any annual property tax levied for the administration of this Act shall be limited to one-half of one mill?
- Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed each year against property in the School District of Oakland County, Michigan, for all purposes except taxes for the payment of interest and principal on obligations incurred prior to December 8, 1952, be increased as provided in Section 21, Article X of the Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1908 for the years 1954 to 1959, both inclusive, by one-twentieth of one percent, (\$20 per \$10,000 of the assessed valuation as qualified for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of The Special Education Act, which statute is designed to encourage the education for handicapped children.

Each person voting on the foregoing propositions must be a registered elector in the City or Township in which the elector resides and must be a citizen of the United States, over twenty-one (21) years of age, a resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days next preceding the election.
