

Memorial Day Services Observed in Troy Twp.

TROY TOWNSHIP—Memorial services were held at 3 p.m. Sunday, in front of the war memorial on the grounds of the Troy township hall, 17 Mile road at Livernois. The gathering was sponsored by the Big Beaver Blue-Star Mothers, chapter 37, and Troy township officials.


HAVE YOU MET
