On Tennis Team At Yale University

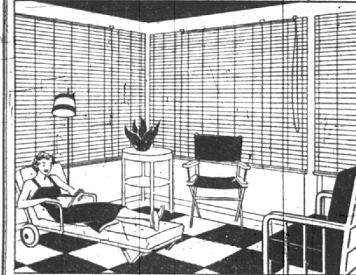

JUNE JIGSAW PUZZLE

WORK

The LAWN has taken much of your time so far—and now it is going to take MORE.

CRABGRASS—A control being tried by many is the application of CHLORDANE to the top 1/2 inch of the soil. Try it NOW—within 3 or 4 days—before the seeds germinate. If it fails (it doesn't cost much) you can go after the plants with:

CRABNOT—a spray (P.C.)
DUST-A-WAY—a powder (P.C.)

CHICKWEED—C.W.K. will take it (and, with a little carelessness, the grass too). However, CRABNOT is a good killer and one of the best is AMMONIUM SULFATE.

GRASS—(This is a method of keeping it—not killing it.)

b) About June 10th to June 20th spread 2 lbs of REGAL LAWN FOOD to each 100 sq. ft.
c) WATER once a week and be sure to get it down 3 to 4 inches.

PLAY

Get a couple of KILLER KANES and see who can spot the most WEEPIES in 30 minutes (A nice prize for this is a new can of weed killer.)

Get busy in the garden with an ALL PURPOSE HOE (with any other tool this is work.)

Order BUCKWHEAT HULLS or PEAT MOSS for spreading on the weedless beds about June 15th. (our aunt's birthday). (This will probably almost insure nearly weed-free beds for the balance of the year.)

RELAXATION
