

Red Cross Group Names Directors, Presents Reports

About 280 persons attended the May 26 Open House which preceded the Oakland County Red Cross annual meeting and were shown through the new headquarters at 118 Franklin in Pontiac.

During the business meeting 37 new directors were named to the 100-man board and a new executive committee of 15 members. This committee will meet later this month to elect chapter officers.

New committee members from this area are Mrs. J. W. Blanchard, Bloomfield Hills; Mrs. Vincent VanFleet, Birmingham; and Harry E. Bruce, Southfield. Mrs. VanFleet will serve for three years.

Final Injections Of Polio Vaccine Given Next Week

Wind-up to the polio vaccine trials in Oakland County in this area will be the week of June 7 according to Dr. John D. Monroe, Oakland county health department director.

Dr. Monroe said 17,110 first, second and third grade children in Oakland County received the first shot, with only 41 in the entire county missing the second shot.

"These," he said "are still eligible for this final booster shot since recent research has proved the effectiveness of a single injection. Earlier findings eliminated a child from completion of the test if the second shot was missed."

THE VACCINE project is sponsored by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis and financed with March of Dimes funds.

Area schools to be processed and dates are June 7, Auding Road school; June 8, East Southfield and John Grace; June 9, Scotch and Green in West Bloomfield, Adams.

Baldwin, Bloomfield Village, Quanton and Holy Name, in Birmingham; Brace and St. Michaels in Southfield; June 10, Roosevelt in West Bloomfield, Franklin, Walnut Lake, Wing Lake, Torry, Lathrup, Magnolia, McKinley and Southfield No. 10.

Each child will receive a pin designating him as a "Pioneer Test" participant.

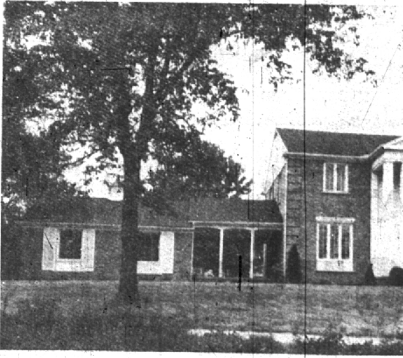

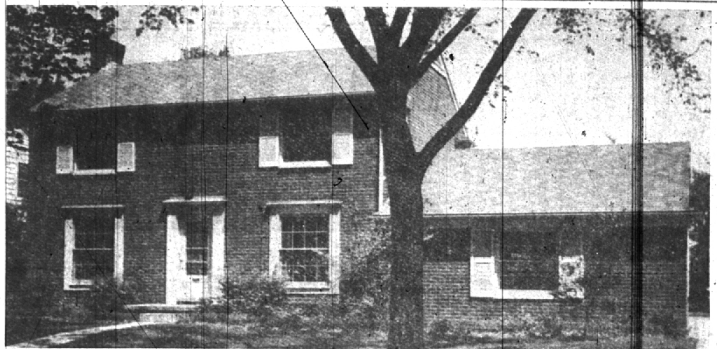

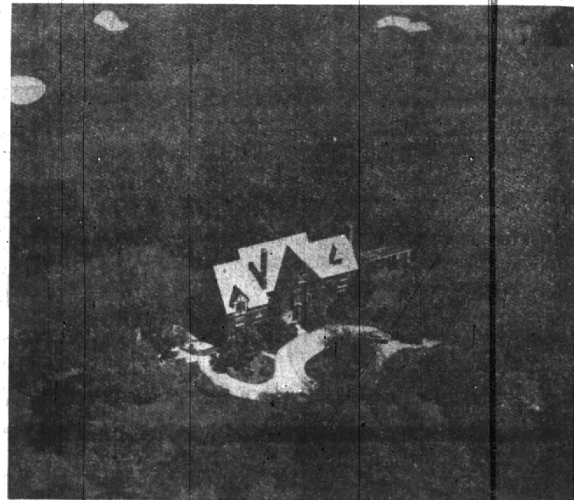
