D. Hale Brake, state treasurer, was the guest speaker for the Birmingham branch of the American Association of University Women's March 10 luncheon meeting at the Birmingham Community House. Brake presented a picture of Michigan state government for the organization's Legislative program. Mrs. Robert F. Kahr, legislative chairman, introduced the speaker.

Brake, a graduate of Albion College and the University of Michigan Law School, began his public career as prosecuting attorney of Montcalm County in 1927. He was elected to the State Senate in 1934 and held the office for four terms. He has been State Treasurer since 1943.

In addition to his office and the working of a 500 acre farm which he owns, he is an active member of a number of committees. He headed a group of county officials to form the Institute of Local Government in 1944 of which he is chairman. It was organized to make a study of county needs and strengthen government locally, according to Brake.

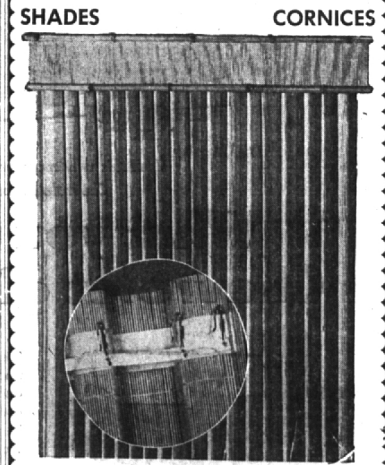

MARCH MISSIVE

This is the month in which there is much to be done, plans to be made, equipment to be conditioned, seeds and bulbs to be started, even outdoor planting if we can get rid of this white California frost.

SOME MAJOR STUFF

1. Line up your yard man, pruning jobs now—before they are all tied up for the summer.
2. Plan your lawn program carefully and accurately. Good lawn seed is very expensive. However, putting on half as much as is required is throwing your money away. There are other ways of being economical.
3. Before throwing lime on everything, have your soil tested.
4. Get the lawn mower sharpened NOW.
5. Plan to do (or have done) the DORMANT SPRAY at the earliest date. Temperature must be over 40° for 24 hours. We can show you simple, reasonable equipment capable of spraying up to 35 or 40 feet high.

SOME MINOR STUFF

1. Plant SWEET PEAS as soon as you can get the ground ready. Try FLORIBUNDA.
2. Prune roses JUST AS BUDS SWELL and BEFORE leaves are out.
3. Start FANCY-LEAVED CALADIUM bulbs now.
4. Hard scale on ivy must be scratched off by hand and then spray with NICOTINE SULFATE.
