**Baptism Instruction
Series Is Planned**

A series of three instruction periods for parents and godparents of children desiring the Sacrament of Holy Baptism at Christ Church Cranbrook, will start Monday, March 29 at 8 p.m. In announcing the series church officials said, "We feel there are enough questions and confusions about baptism to make some prior discussion of it both helpful and necessary for a better understanding of its significance."

Described as "one of the oldest traditions of the church, a tradition which dates back to the first century," this church rite will be observed at a special service on April 17, at 4 p.m.

"CHRISTIAN SCIENCE: Certain and Complete Healing Available for All," will be the topic of John D. Pickett, when he speaks at the First Church of Christ, Scientist, here on March 26. The lecture, scheduled for 8:15 p.m., will deal with the practical application of Bible teachings and their spiritual power to the solution of today's problems. The speaker, a member of the Christian Science Board of Lectureship, is on a nationwide tour. Former president of his own investment banking firm, Pickett liquidated his business affairs in 1912, to devote full time to the public in the practice of Christian Science healing.
