

### Area Residents Receiving 1954 Easter Seals

This week Birmingham residents take their place with the 30 million Americans who will receive envelopes of Easter seals, and a letter asking that they contribute to the 1954 campaign to help crippled children.

Matthew Cammareri, heading the campaign in this area, released a few pertinent facts which he believes will give a clearer understanding of the drive.

"The Society for Crippled Children and Adults was founded on the belief that crippled children are an ever-present part of society," Cammareri said. "The Easter seal drive makes it possible for these disabled youngsters to make the most of their abilities, and eventually take their rightful places in the world."

HE EXPLAINED the annual sale is conducted during the spring season between March 15 and April 18, to coincide with Easter Sunday. There are society units in every state, District of Columbia, Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico, each sponsoring the drive in its own territory.

In Michigan, 91.7 per cent of every dollar remains in the state to meet the needs of hundreds of physically handicapped persons. The remaining amount goes to the national society for the work done by the parent organization throughout the country. This includes education and research.

SERVICES AND facilities financed by Easter Seal contributions include: special diagnostic clinics, medical care, physical, occupational and speech therapy, rehabilitation centers, summer camping, convalescent care, special schools and classes for those unable to attend regular schools, vocational training, wheel chairs, braces, crutches and other therapeutic aids, occupational therapy and crafts for the "home-bound" and many others.

In conclusion, Cammareri asked local residents to mail their contributions as soon as possible, in order that records could be completed promptly.

## Coach Sees Squad Stopped Just Short Of State Finals

When the favored Highland Park basketball team lost its bid for state championship in the Class A semi-finals Friday night at East Lansing, at least one Birmingham resident was vitally concerned. He is James M. Wink, 2112 Manchester, who is head coach of the Highland Park squad.

Wink has seen his boys go through the regular basketball season undefeated. They had gotten by the quarterfinals on the way to the state championship by swamping Pontiac in the Birmingham high school gym Wednesday night, March 17.

BUT FRIDAY night it was a different story as a speedy Muskegon Heights team put down the Highland Parkers by the narrow margin of 49 to 47.

This year the Parkers had piled up 18 wins to no defeats when they ran into Muskegon Heights. "We're disappointed that we didn't win, but we lost to a very good team," Wink said Monday.

BEING INVOLVED in state championship tournaments is not new to Wink. During his seven years' tenure as head basketball coach at Highland Park high, he has shaped one state champion squad and three others that have come very close.

In 1951, Wink's squad was beaten in the final game for the state crown. His team came back to sweep away all competition and took the crown in 1952.

In 1953 with a 17 win and 2 lost record, Wink's team lost out in the state semifinals.
