

Recreation Board Lays Plans For Summer Program

Several new features have been added this year to the Birmingham recreation board's summer program.

A junior sports program will be initiated at the Birmingham high school gymnasium. Boys and girls from the fourth grade up will be supervised groups in basketball, badminton, table tennis, archery, baseball, roller skating, volleyball and other activities.

A day camp at Springdale Park is another innovation. Fifty children a day will be accommodated at the park. They will bring their own lunches and must provide their own transportation. At the park there will be woodcraft, playground, golf, cook-outs and if weather is bad, an indoor program.

AN ENLARGED instrumental musical program is being offered this year. Classes will be arranged in accordance with ability and individual interests and both the experienced and non-experienced will be welcomed.

Other regular recreational facilities swimming at Barnum pool, radio-dramas at Birmingham high school, baseball at nine local grounds, golf at Springdale, tennis at Eton park, and craft shop at Barnum school.

Also being offered is instruction in the safe use of firearms. Boys and girls nine years or over may learn to shoot at the police shooting range at Oakbrook and Lincoln.

More detailed information on registration and times of the various programs will appear in The Birmingham Eccentric at a later date.

Consider Licenses For Parking Lots

An annual license would be required to operate a parking lot used by the general public if an ordinance proposed by the city plan board is adopted by the city commission.

Commissioners held off discussing the measure until interested groups or individuals such as present parking lot owners, have had an opportunity to study the recommended legislation.

As presently drawn, the ordinance would require existing lots to be hard surfaced within three years of its adoption, and future lots could be given up to two years to provide an asphalt or cement surface.

OCAWS '54 Meeting Set for This Month

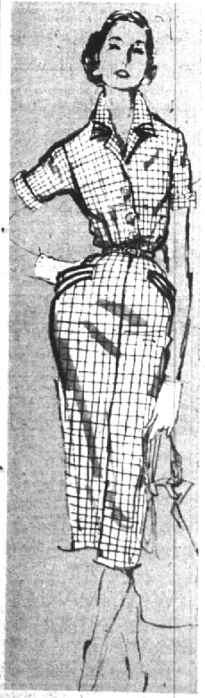

Final Square Dance

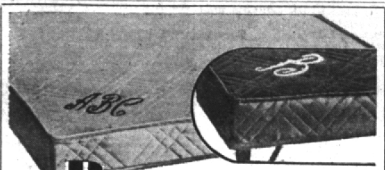
