## LVW To Present Bulletin Skits at May 24 Meeting

"How candidates are interviewed for the League of Women Voters pre-election candidates' bulletins" will be demonstrated at the May 24 meeting of the Birmingham League at 1:15 p.m. at the Community House.

Otis Thompson will enact the role of a candidate for the state legislature being interviewed by League Voters' service committee members and William E. Roberts will appear as his campaign manager.

In the preparation of the bulletins issued by the committee before elections, each candidate is asked prescribed questions about his position on timely questions and about his own background.

THESE interviews are compiled in a bulletin which is distributed free in downtown Birmingham and by mail to members and financial contributors to the LVW.

A demonstration of methods of distribution of the bulletin will be a second part of the program, with a skit illustrating how the bulletins should or should not be handed out to the prospective voters passing manned booths.

Customarily there are about seven such booths in the banks and markets of Birmingham, and it takes about 60 women to hand out from 4 to 5 thousand bulletins in the three days preceding an election.

Passing of the women's suffrage amendment in 1921 will be the subject of a pantomime with 1921 vintage costumes, and a brief report of activities at the national convention by Mrs. Peter Loomis and Mrs. F. Chalmers Smith, Birmingham delegates.
