TROY TOWNSHIP—At the varsity baseball game, Troy high school beat Avondale 9-6. The game was played on the Avondale diamond. The girls beat Fitzgerald in an exciting softball game, the score being 13-12. Troy had four home run hits which were made by Betty Kujala, Virginia Gac, Mary Stetler and Barbara Hunt. The battery for Troy was Nancy Walker and Betty Kujala.

Troy topped Clawson in a track meet held on Clawson's track by the score of 60-40. Graydon Chinski captured the Medley Relay. Fred Burnard set Troy's record for the 100 yard dash, his time was 9.10.3. Max Langford came in third place.

George Beach won the mile run, with his best time of the year which was 5:04. Tom Peterson and Jim Murdoch placed first and third respectively in the 220 event. Troy placed sixth in the Central Michigan Relays. Troy placed first in the mile relay with Jim Pouget, Eugene Tomko, Tom Peterson and Fred Burnard, each running a leg. In the 800 relay, Fred Burnard, Eugene Tomko, Tom Peterson and Max Langford placed third.

Troy tied the triangular meet by 1/2 point, capturing both first and second places in the hurdles. Graydon Chinski and Rex Moore placed first and second respectively. Fred Burnard, Eugene Tomko and Tom Peterson took first, second and third place honors in the 440. Jim Pouget came in first and set Troy's record with the time of 4:57.6 in the mile run.

Graydon Chinski came in second in the high hurdles. Harold Feldman ran the 220 and placed second. Hank Wright, Gary Wilcox, Bob Tasker and George Burnard ran the medley relay and came in first. In the 880 relays, Troy placed first. Eugene Tomko, Tom Peterson, Fred Burnard and Harold Feldman doing the honors.

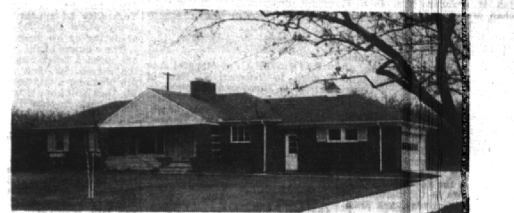
