## AAUW to Sponsor June 16 Bloodmobile

Birmingham AAUW is sponsoring the Red Cross Bloodmobile when it returns to the Community House June 16. Miss Jeanne Lloyd, chairman of the committee, and her workers who are responsible for recruiting blood donors, attended an orientation meeting held last week at Christ Church Cranbrook by the Oakland County Red Cross mobile unit.

Mrs. Vincent VanFleet, vice chairman of the Red Cross blood program; Mrs. Sheldon Noble, chairman of service groups; Mrs. Bradlee Pruden, chairman of volunteers, and Mrs. Edward Lerchen, recruitment chairman, were among the Birmingham women who spoke on the donor program.

The special need for donors at this time of the year was explained as due to the Fourth of July weekend. Twice as much blood is needed in the summer and Oakland county uses a great amount in traffic accidents.

Whole blood lasts 21 days, so the blood donated June 16 may be used on July 4th, or it may be used in plasma for civil defense and in gamma globulin for childhood diseases.

The Bloodmobile will be at the Community House from 2 to 5 p.m. and from 6 to 8 p.m., Wednesday, June 16. Those wishing to make an appointment may contact Mrs. William Morgan, 1343 Brookwood avenue, Birmingham.

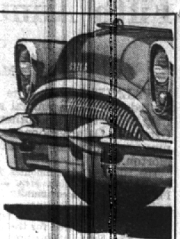

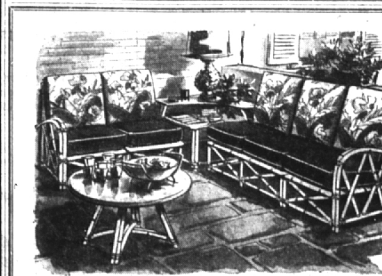
