## Police, Court Support Drive For Safe Passing

Birmingham Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley and Justice John J. Gaffill announced today that both the police department and Birmingham Justice court will cooperate in the Michigan State Safety commission on a statewide public education program aimed at reducing traffic accidents due to dangerous passing.

The campaign's official poster "Share the Lane - Keep in Lane" will be displayed in the courtroom and each traffic defendant will be given a safety leaflet containing 20 tips on safe passing during June and July, Judge Gaffill said.

Moxley pointed out that passing is one of the most dangerous and difficult of driving maneuvers.

HE STRESSED that motorists should be particularly careful in passing on short city streets where cars are parked on both sides of the street and where the driver may come close to an intersection before completing the process of passing.

Judge Gaffill explained that passing involves many different traffic violations, such as the following:

- 1) Crossing the center line on a four-lane roadway.
- 2) Pulling into the left hand lane of a three-lane highway.
- 3) Speeding (going 35 or 40 to pass a car going 25 in a business or residential district), or exceeding posted speed limits on the highway when passing.
- 4) Cutting-in on the car you are passing.
- 5) Failing to signal when you pull out to pass.
- 6) "Sneaking too close" to the car ahead when anxious to pass—resulting in a rear-end collision when the car ahead stops suddenly.
- 7) Passing at an intersection, hill or curve.
- 8) Combinations of speeding and passing, or passing when someone is endangered may result in a charge of reckless driving.

JUDGE GAFILL made a plea to all motorists to cooperate with the government and safety officials so that the accident curve may be bent downward without the necessity of more violators being punished in Court and losing their licenses.

## Collision Laid To Brake Failure

A brake failure was blamed for minor injuries to a 25-year-old Pontiac housewife early Thursday morning in an auto accident at the intersection of Woodward and Square Lake road, Bloomfield township police said.

Mrs. Delores Tripp, 2238 Avondale, was treated and released from St. Joseph Mercy hospital, Pontiac, for bruises she suffered when her car was struck by one driven by Mrs. Ruth Allen, 38, of 249 E. Palmer, Detroit.

Mrs. Allen told police her car's brakes failed, causing it to enter the intersection against a red light and collide with Mrs. Tripp's car.

## Artist Kozlow's Work Exhibited

MacManus, John & Adams, Inc., Bloomfield Hills, a advertising agency, is exhibiting selected works of famed Detroit artist Richard Kozlow.

At 28, Kozlow is holder of a dozen high awards, including the Art Directors Gold Medal Award for the last three consecutive years.

Art Director Edwin Paull, who arranged the showing, feels agency personnel will find these contemporary paintings both interesting and challenging.

The 20 paintings of modernist Kozlow represent his extreme versatility, unusual techniques and varying depths of mood.

## Annual Exhibition At Art Academy To Open May 27

Seven fields of art will be comprehensively illustrated by the work of Cranbrook Academy of Art students when the annual exhibition opens in the lower galleries of the Academy museum Thursday, May 27 for approximately six weeks.

Designed and set up by the students themselves, the exhibition will include selected work in painting, sculpture, design, weaving, ceramics, metalworking and projects in architecture.

Among the most unusual displays will be three-dimensional models, charts and plans for the modernization of the town of Marietta, Ohio. Commissioned by civic leaders of the town, five Cranbrook architects, all candidates for master's degrees, undertook a complete study of the community's expanding industry, transportation, recreational needs and housing.

Their illustrated suggestions for the most attractive and economical future development will be on view until shipped to Marietta.

SCULPTURE in wood, welded iron and cast bronze will be shown

by three sculptors, Robert Creman, Paul Granlund and Benjamin Goe, a 11 of whom were recently granted Fulbright Scholarships for study in Italy. Creman, who won national honors for ceramics in the Designer-Craftsman Show in New York this year, will also show pottery.

Weaver Charlotte Engle, who won first prize for a rug at the national crafts show in St. Paul, Minn., will exhibit woven textiles; and Clyde Burt, winner of four national ceramics prizes this year, will have pottery on display.

The museum of Cranbrook Academy of Art is open daily from 2 to 5 p.m., except Mondays when it is closed.
