R. Crabb, who received them from the experimental department of Michigan State College) and 100 multi flora rose (rose hedge) plantings, recently purchased with part of the proceeds received from the Wing Lake Shores Farm and Garden Club's benefit card party, May 12.

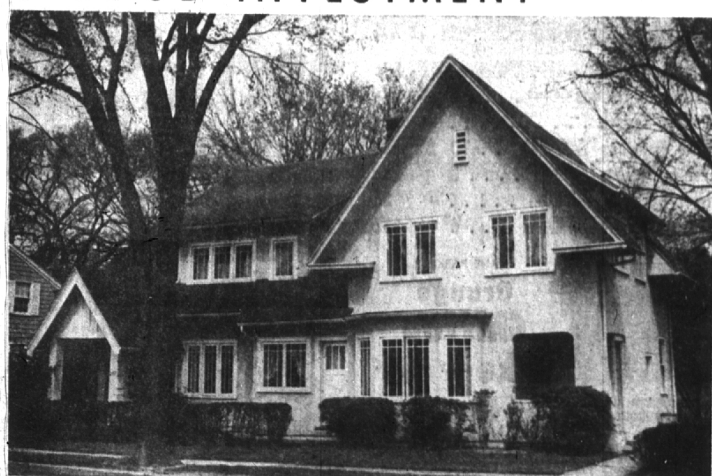
