**Sponsored School Tours Through Institute May End**

A two-year program of lectures and guided tours for area school children at Cranbrook Institute of Science may end soon unless some new means of obtaining funds to defray costs of a lecture-guide is found, Dr. Robert T. Hatt, Institute director, said this week.

WITH THE exhaustion of the funds provided by the AAUW, new ways must be found to provide these services if they are to continue.

"While school groups always are welcome to visit the exhibits of the Institute museum free of charge, it unfortunately is impossible for the Institute's own limited budget to provide the lectures, demonstrations and instruction which have proved so valuable to elementary pupils," said Hatt.

Over 10 percent of the students of Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills schools have received lectures and guided tours during the past six months.

IN ALL, 1,371 children have visited the museum during this period, and 1,054 have at the request of their teachers, obtained the services of Mrs. Doris McKillan for the guided lecture.

Groups from other districts have paid for the lecture tours at a rate of \$3.50 per hour. Cost to the AAUW has been 12 cents per student-visit from the Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills districts.

Said Paul D. Carter, assistant superintendent of Birmingham schools, "Museums have much to offer that is obtainable nowhere else in a concrete manner. Without a lecture-guide, much of the educational value is lost to visiting groups. I feel that we need the educational facilities of Cranbrook Institute of Science for Birmingham district children. I believe, too, that the guide service should be continued if at all possible, and that within the school system it is our job to develop better utilization of a splendid educational facility."

BESIDES offering the largest collection of natural history exhibits in the Detroit area, the Institute has made available to school groups its astronomical observatory, and expects to have by next winter a projection planetarium that will provide demonstrations for 100 students at a time.

Both of these facilities require the presence of a trained instructor whose services must be financed by fees for each demonstration, unless funds are provided by an interested community organization, Hatt said.
