

Scout Heads Plan Camporee In May

A planning committee meeting for the district 1 Camporee was held last week at the home of E. W. Averil, 419 Westwood. This group is planning the activities for the Boy Scout troops of the Northern Community that will camp out at Kensington on May 21, 22 and 23.

Events in which the scouts will compete include log chopping, first relay, cardboard relay race, fire building and water boiling, blindfolded compass course, knot relay, flagjack contest, rescue race using fireman's carry, height judging and tug-o-war.

All Scouts in District 1, including Explorers, are eligible to attend and over 1,000 scouts are expected to participate.

Committee members include Scoutmaster and camping chairman of the various troops in the northern communities and in attendance were Don Tracy and Ken Bristol of B-11; Harry Muenchinger of B-5; Eric W. Jacobson of B-7; John Southard and Walter Carr of B-26; Russell Cullen of B-29; Charles Waite of B-25 and Harold De Orlov, Mark Duffield and Bob Englehardt of B-4.

These men and a large group of other leaders are expected to supervise the camp site to which the Northern Community has been assigned. Explorers from the various troops will be instructed to judge the events and will be assigned to judge the Scouts in Communities different from those from which the Explorers came. Last year more than 100 participated from this community and this year we hope that more than 200 will take advantage of this unequalled opportunity to camp alongside the members of other troops and other Communities.
