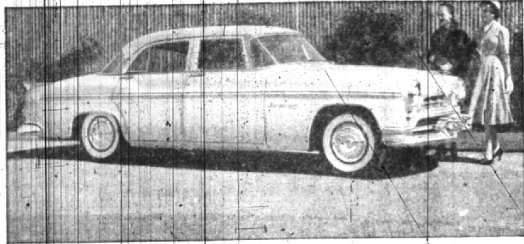


**Sign New Contract With Plan Advisor**
