

South Birmingham Branch Bank Opens Monday, Nov. 22

Banking services will be opened at the South Birmingham office of the Birmingham National bank, 1954 S. Woodward, Monday, Nov. 22, at 9 a.m., according to Herbert H. Gardner, bank president.

Citing the bank's expansion in the last 10 years, Gardner reveals that the Birmingham bank has experienced a growth of 350 per cent in the 10-year span and ranks fifth in the nation for rate of

growth among banks of comparable size. Gardner stated that the South branch of the bank was built to serve the needs of the fast-growing North Woodward area.

The open house Monday will continue from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. but banking services will close at the regular 3 p.m. hour.

THE PARKING lot, accommo-

dating 60 cars, may be entered either from Woodward, 14 Mile, or Bird street.

The new office of contemporary design provides 7,500 square feet of floor space, in addition to the interior arrangement for teller and other clerical services, five drive-in windows have been installed, three of which will be opened on Monday.

A buy arrangement affords

space for banking officers and a conference area.

The entire building is air-conditioned and its other appointments reflect the latest in banking improvements, according to Gardner.

The branch will be staffed by personnel from the main office and all banking services will be available.

A large vault offers extensive safety deposit box facilities. Adjoining the vault are spacious, well-lighted booths for the convenience of customers.
