She never wears it. She should ask herself: "Will I ever sew this thing?" or "Am I just kidding myself?" then act accord-

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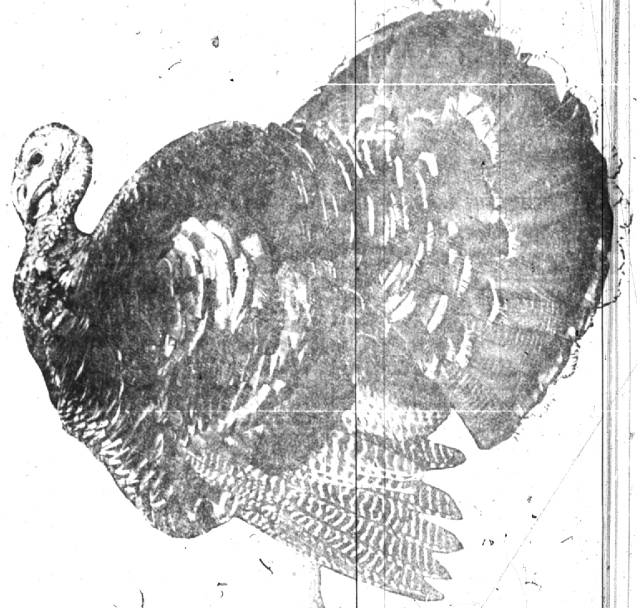
Shrine Mothers To Model at Show, Luncheon
