

Christ Church Will Present Haydn Oratorio

A famous English lady, her sea-faring lover and a naval victory combined to inspire composer Haydn to write the "most dramatic and powerful" of his own masses, "The Lord Nelson Mass". This oratorio-like production will be presented in a public performance at Christ Church Cranbrook on Sunday, Nov. 14 at 4 p.m. for the first time in this area.

Haydn was a devoted follower of Lord Nelson's campaigns. He kept a chart of Nelson's Battle of the Nile, using colored pins to indicate the British Admiral's progress. News of Nelson's sea victory is supposed to have inspired the composer to write the mass, particularly the thunderous conclusion.

SHORTLY AFTER the Nile victory, Haydn became close friends with Nelson and Lady Hamilton. For her, he wrote the "Nelson Mass".

Performance of the mass will be under the direction of Dr. Maurice A. Garabrant, music director of Christ Church Cranbrook. Dr. Garabrant is currently being featured in "Circumstances" as organist with the Long Island choir.

Soloists for the mass will be bass Russell Skitch, well known oratorio singer; Mary Louise Lindquist and Mary Jane Walker, singing soprano leads; Margaret Jewell, alto; and Carl Christiansen, tenor.

Assisting the soloists will be the full choir of Christ Church Cranbrook, a string ensemble and two trumpets.
