Getting all their touchdowns in a big second quarter, the Birmingham reserves turned back a heavy but slow East Detroit team 20-6 on the Shamrocks field.

In the first quarter Birmingham started a march spearheaded by a powerful ground attack. The drive ended on the East Detroit 14 yard line when the Maples ran out of down. The Shamrocks quickly moved the ball out of the danger zone.

In the opening damage of the second quarter, the Maples hit on a 25-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Bob Peckheiser to left end Dale Burrows. Peckheiser kicked the extra point.

Birmingham got a big break on the following kickoff when a weak kick caught the East Siders by surprise and enabled the Maples to recover on the Shamrocks' 35 yard line.

FOUR DAYS LATER the same touchdown combination of Peckheiser to Burrows linked again. This time the scoring came from 25 yards out. Peckheiser's attempt for the extra point was blocked.

The Shamrocks took the kickoff and started a drive of their own, but a clipping nearly nullified a long gain and sent them back into their own territory. A fumble pass on fourth down sent a deflated and the Maples took over on the Shamrocks' 47 yard line.

Birmingham drove to the two-point conversion.
