


Injured Maples Meet Parkers

An injury-riddled Birmingham football team travels to Hazel Park tomorrow night to engage a strong Viking squad, with the kickoff set for 8 p.m. at Hazel Park's recently dedicated B. N. Griggs field.

J. D. Webster, new head coach at Hazel Park, will be taking his first Eastern Michigan league win after battling East Detroit to a 10-0 deadlock last week. Likewise Coach Carl Lemle's team, in his initial season at Birmingham, has yet to win a League game, dropping 19-13 and 26-0 decisions to Al. Clemens and Ferndale.

Along with tying East Detroit, the Parkers have beaten First Beecher 20-7 and Muskegon Catholic Central 19-12, while losing to powerful Royal Oak 19-7. Against East Detroit last Friday a short-handed Hazel Park 11 completely dominated play but couldn't punch over a score, having the ball once on the Shamrock three yard line before losing it on downs.

Smarting under two straight League setbacks on consecutive Fridays, their only two losses in four starts, the Parkers will attempt to avenge last year's 13-0 defeat at the hands of the Parkers. Birmingham has been hampered lately by the loss of several key performers. Defensive end Jim Johnson has a broken bone in his ankle and is probably sidelined for the remainder of the season, while quarterback Bill Swaney is recovering from the removal of an ulcer on his left eye.

Besides the normal number of bumps and bruises there were no major injuries after last Friday's game, with the exception of tackle Bob Miller, who is nursing two fractured ribs but is expected back in the lineup tomorrow.

Although Coach Webster is "confident of Friday night's outcome," he warns that "Birmingham is big, and we're not selling them short. We understand Birmingham has a new coach and we think their new offensive will be in our favor." He said, "It will be a battle of the lines."

Bham Reserves Lose To Links

Playing against a driving rain and a stubborn Ferndale aggression, the Birmingham reserve team lost its first home game of the season 14-7 Monday afternoon at Perry field.

The game was scoreless until the latter stages of the first quarter when Dave Muller's high lighted a 56 yard Maple drive by scoring 16 yards out. Ron Sandberg converted.

The three-yard pass from Quarterback Calmire to left end Detroit put Ferndale back in the game midway through the second quarter. The try for extra point was blocked and the Maples led by halftime 7-0.

Ferndale opened the second half by using straight power plays and drove to the Birmingham one yard line where the locals' Jim Fry pounced on a Rasplitter fumble. However, a bad pass from center resulted in a Ferndale safety when Maple Bob Preksher fell on the ball in the end zone.

Malachi Gidson whizzed 40 yards for a Ferndale score late in the third quarter. The pass for the extra point failed.
