Professor Speaks To Baldwin PTA On Sex Education

"Sex Education in the Home" will be the subject of a talk to be given by Dr. William Wattenberg, professor of educational psychology at Wayne University, for members and friends of the Baldwin PTA Monday, Oct. 18, at 8 p.m. in the Baldwin school auditorium. The film "Human Beginnings" will be shown.

Dr. Wattenberg will base his talk around the idea that the home is the logical and best place for the sex education of children. This instruction may be religious in its approach to the meaning and purpose of marriage or it may be given in terms of people living together. Either way it can stem from happenings in the home or surroundings.
