Jan. 10 Date Set For Nurses Aides Training Classes

Applications for volunteer nurse aides classes, sponsored by Oakland county American Red Cross, are being taken next week at both the Royal Oak and Pontiac offices.

Beginning on Jan. 10, classes will be held at St. Joseph Mercy hospital, Pontiac. Training is not designed to prepare applicants for paid positions as practical nurses, but rather to train women to help nurses in hospitals and bloodmobile visits, and to have a reserve of trained workers in case of disaster for six or seven weeks.

Applicants for the 80 hour course must be between 18 and 55, in good health and have had no recent serious illness. High school education or its equivalent in business school is needed.

South Oakland county applicants will talk with Mrs. John A. Legato, NA, chairman, Oct. 21 and makes up the course. Classes are four hours each, beginning at 9 Royal Oak office. Applicants may call, running three days a week phone for appointment.
