The Jopatom Players, a new theatre group, has been organized in the city of Birmingham. Patricia and Joseph Zabelski and Thomas Leick, 344 West Brown Street, have combined their talents to serve a waiting public with a higher plane of artistic production.

Act Two will begin with Piano Impressionisms and for its climax, will present an unusual dance drama, with narration entitled the "Five Worlds of Creation."

LEICK, WHO IS DIRECTOR and choreographer, has also designed the sets and created the costumes for this show. Each act will be a complete unit, fused together without interruption to maintain the mood.

Assisting in the cast are Shirley Mathes and Jacqueline Morrison, both of Detroit. Ron Howell, Detroit, is technical director, and Joseph Laichalk, Detroit, is in charge of sound direction.

Following this production the Jopatom Players will present Zabelski in a piano concert while the group reads itself for another Review. The season will end with a full-length play.

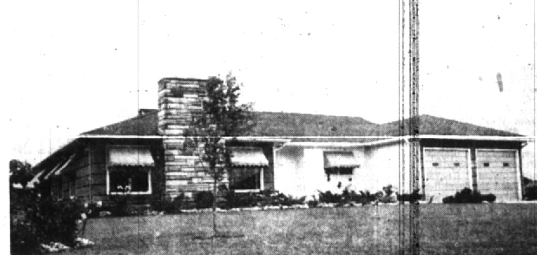

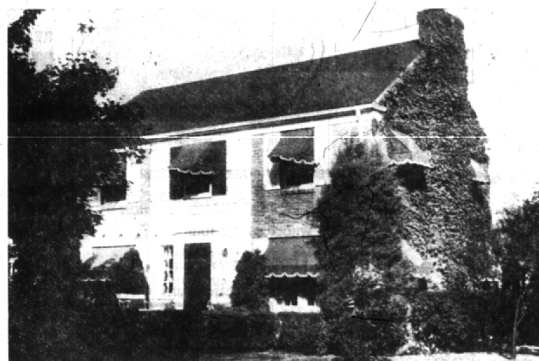
