Birmingham board of education Tuesday night authorized Supt. Dr. Dwight B. Ireland to advertise for bids for sale of the \$1,750,000—the remaining half of the \$3,500,000 building and site bonds approved by the voters last June.

The board instructed Ireland to advertise for bids before December 1 or early in 1955, whichever appeared to be the better marketing time. Sale of the first series was to Halsey Stuart and Company at a net interest rate of 2.9188 per cent.
