## Kings Pepparkakor, Sprits Are Two Favorites of Swedish Cookie Fans

"Swedish cookies are a short cut to a man's heart," says Mrs. Victor Farrah (nee Peterson) who lives at 7410 West Greenwich drive.

With a family from Stockholm it's expected that one know how to make Swedish cookies, however, you can hardly find a recipe "like Grandma used to make" because even Grandma changed them through the years! Some Grandmas like more spice than others, some added a pinch of this and some a pinch of that.

Mrs. Farrah has tried a lot of ginger and cloves; one teaspoon allspice; three tablespoons dark corn syrup (don't skip); one cup whipping cream, whipped; six cups all purpose flour; one tablespoon

cream butter and sugar. Add egg yolks and cream. Fold in flour, cream of tartar, and add extract. Put dough in cookie press and shape in the form of S's and O's. Bake in a moderate oven—350 degrees from 10 to 12 minutes or until light brown.

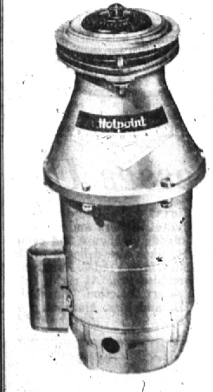
